They will also possess advanced clinical competencies to independently conduct patient assessments, formulate diagnoses, initiate and interpret diagnostic investigations, prescribe therapeutic interventions, and carry out authorized procedures within the NPs scope of practice.

- The Nurse Practitioner will be responsible for working collaboratively with the Physicians to provide high quality care to 84 long term care residents.
- Conduct in-depth comprehensive assessments integrating a wide range of complex information including resident perspectives, staff perspectives, nursing and allied health theory and research including completing holistic health histories, mental status and physical examinations;
- Diagnose some acute health conditions and facilitate the diagnosis of chronic health conditions, collaborating with the physician as necessary;
- Take a leadership role in the development of integrated strategies for illness prevention, health promotion, health maintenance, rehabilitation and restorative care;
- Monitor the ongoing therapy of residents with chronic stable illness by providing effective pharmacological, complementary, and/or counselling interventions;
- Prescribe pharmacological agents and therapeutic measures and independently perform additional controlled acts as outlined in the College of Nurses Standards of Practice for RN (EC);
